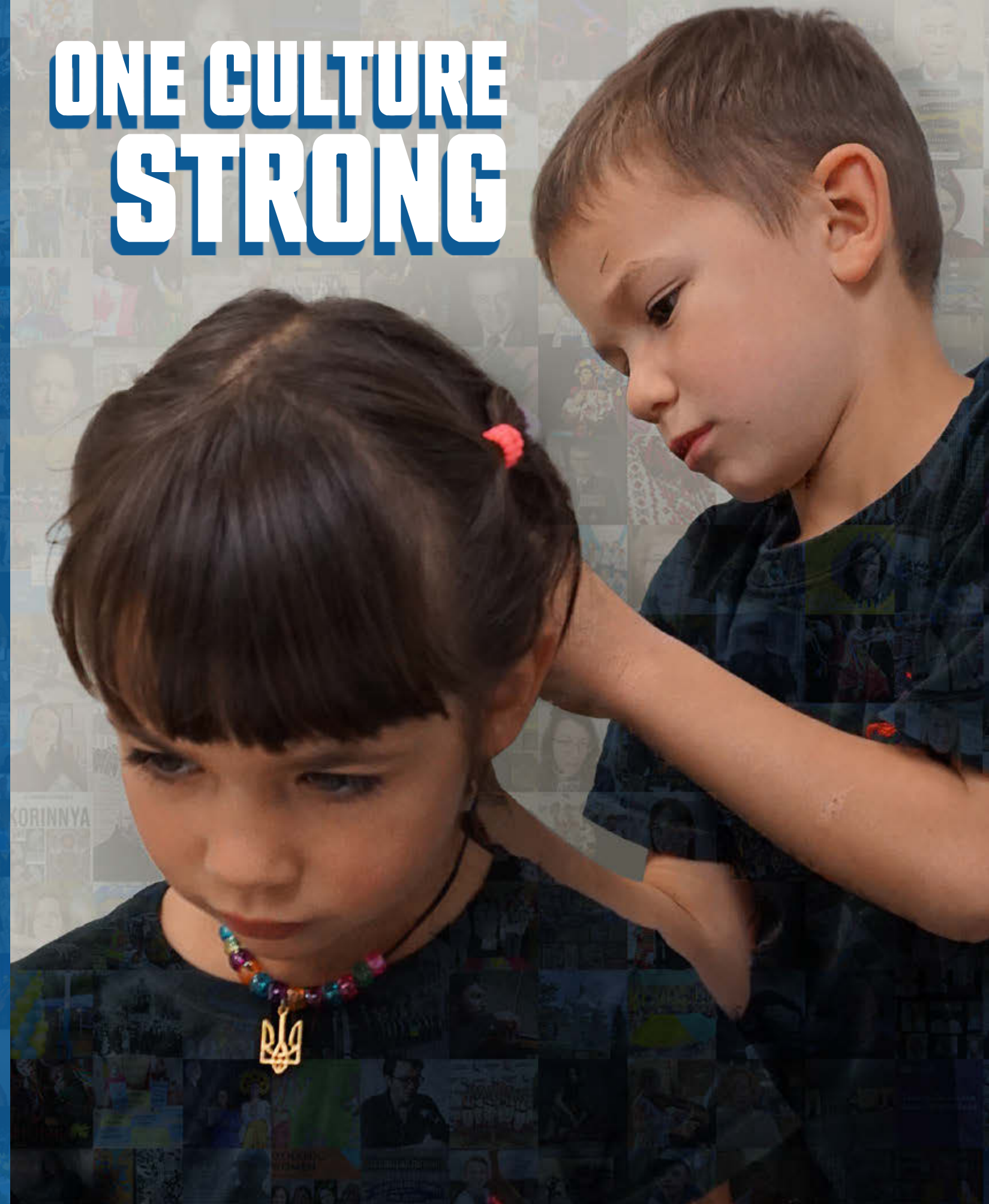

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our Commitment

This past year has been a very successful, yet challenging year for the Shevchenko Foundation (TSF). The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic continued to be felt, as many staples of our community life were again cancelled or changed to comply with the new reality.

More recently, the genocidal war in Ukraine unleashed by Russia has justifiably shifted the priorities of the community to an aid effort for Ukrainians in Ukraine and the many displaced in Canada fleeing the war.

I am pleased to share with you that TSF effectively responded to these challenges. At our fiscal year-end on March 31, 2022, our investment portfolio increased from 2021 by \$4.5M or 9.1% to surpass \$54.4M. We proudly supported the projects of 55 organizations and 24 individuals with an allocation of \$537,702 in grants and provided over \$55,000 in sponsorships of cultural events and community media nationwide. The portfolio also included funds we manage on behalf of other Ukrainian organizations, providing them access to a broader capital pool and professional management to improve their returns, as well as designated funds we distribute in accordance with the direction of specific donors.

We are grateful for our donor partnerships that have resulted in successful initiatives in support of community development and inspiring our artists to excel in their craft. The Temerty Foundation stepped up to help the community remain engaged during the pandemic. The Ihnatowycz Family Foundation recognizes our emerging artists through the REACH Mentorship/Residency for the Arts. The Myhal Family Foundation is the driving force behind the Tryzub Awards Gala. We proudly present these initiatives on subsequent pages of this report.

Another successful event was the 2022 KOBZAR™ Book Award ceremony with the virtual presentation introducing the award to a broader Canadian audience.

The full effect of the February invasion of Ukraine is still uncertain. It will clearly affect our financial position going forward, including donations to the Foundation, as more money is understandably directed to the humanitarian crisis being faced by Ukrainians. But Russia's attack on the Ukrainian nation and its culture clearly reinforces the importance of our long-term goals to support a flourishing Ukrainian community and Ukrainian-Canadian culture that further testifies to the resilience and strength of the Ukrainian nation.

A heartfelt thank you to our dedicated Directors, Committee members, and Staff who collectively contribute to the Foundation's continued success. The road ahead will continue to be challenging as we roll out new programs while redoubling our fundraising efforts to address the growing needs and opportunities in our community.

In partnership with you, our generous donors, TSF will continue to steadily build our national endowment fund – a legacy of the Ukrainian community in Canada – for the benefit of many future generations. Your unwavering support enables us to nurture the development of Ukrainian culture in Canada for a strong community and powerful cultural identity that will never be erased. That remains our commitment to you.

Наше зобов'язання

Минулий рік був дуже успішним, але непростим для Шевченківської фундації. Негативний вплив пандемії відчув кожен. Багато заходів у нашому громадському житті було знову скасовано або змінено, щоб пристосуватися до нової реальності.

Останнім часом, у відповідь на геноцидну війну Росії в Україні, громада виправдано змінила свої пріоритети на допомогу українцям в Україні та багатьом переселенцям, які змушені втікати з України та переселитися до Канади.

Я радий поділитися з вами тим, що Фундація ефективно відповіла на ці виклики. На кінець нашого фінансового року, 31 березня 2022 року, фінансові інвестиції Фундації зросли, у порівнянні з 2021 роком, на 4.5M або 9.1%, щоб перевищити \$54.4M. Ми з гордістю підтримали проекти 55 організацій і 24 осіб, які отримали дотації на суму \$537,702 і надали понад \$55,000 на підтримку культурних заходів та громадських засобів масової інформації в Канаді. Фінансові інвестиції Фундації також включають фонди інших українських організацій, якими ми, в їхньому імені, керуємо. Таким способом ми надаємо їм доступ до кращих можливостей збільшити свій дохід, а призначені фонди ми розподіляємо згідно з бажанням окремих жертводавців.

Ми вдячні за співпрацю із жертводавцями, яка привела до успішних ініціатив, у результаті чого ми допомогли у розвитку громади, а українських мистців надихнули на нові звершення у їхній майстерності. Фонд родини Темертеїв допоміг громаді в скрутний час пандемії. Фонд родини Ігнатовичів допомагає молодим мистцям через програму «REACH Mentorship/Residency for the Arts». Фонд родини Мигалів є рушійною силою гали «Tryzub Awards». Ми з гордістю представляємо ці ініціативи на наступних сторінках цього звіту.

Ще одним успішним заходом було вручення книжкової премії «КОБЗАР» 2022 року у віртуальному форматі, що уможливило участь гостей з цілої Канади.

До тепер повний ефект лютевого вторгнення в Україну не зовсім виразний. Це явно вплине на наше фінансове становище в майбутньому, включно з пожертвами на діяльність Фундації, оскільки все більше коштів, і це зрозуміло, спрямовується на полегшення тягара гуманітарної кризи, з якою стикаються українці. Але наступ Росії на українську націю і її культуру явно підсилює важливість наших довгострокових цілей — підтримка української громади та процвітання українсько-канадської культури, що свідчить про стійкість і силу української нації.

Сердечно дякуємо нашим відданим Директорам, Членам комітетів та Працівникам, які разом сприяють продовженню успіхів Фундації. Попереду нас чекає нелегка праця зі збору коштів для вирішення зростаючих потреб у нашій громаді. Але ми віримо, що розпочнемо нові програми, подвоїмо зусилля і допоможемо вирішити нагальні зростаючі потреби нашої громади.

У партнерстві з Вами, нашими щедрими Жертводавцями, Шевченківська фундація продовжуватиме невпинно розбудовувати наш фонд — спадщину української громади в Канаді — на благо багатьох майбутніх поколінь. Ваша непохитна підтримка дозволяє нам плекати та розвивати українську культуру в Канаді, щоб наша ідентичність ніколи не була применшена, недооцінена чи, взагалі, стерта. Це залишається нашим зобов'язанням супроти Вас.

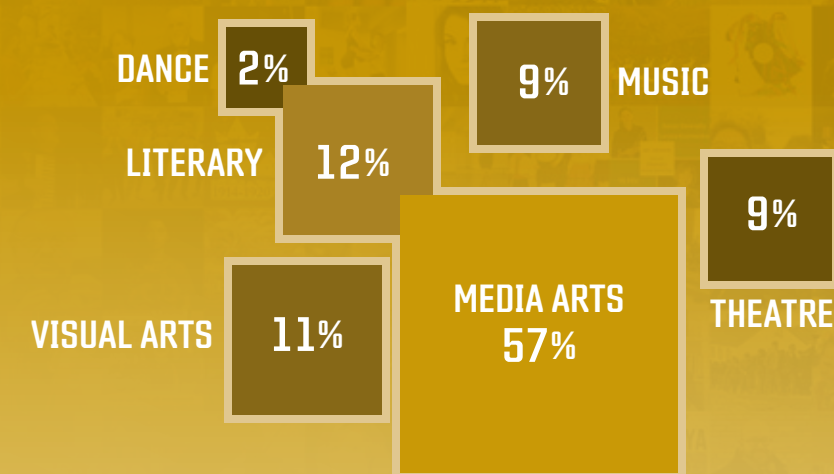

Most recently, it was dedicated to all those impacted by the invasion of Ukraine, with the intention that these pieces might comfort them in their suffering and grief. I am now writing a "Liturgy of Hope" (including these pieces) as my contribution to the uplifting of Ukrainians around the world at this difficult time in our history.

It is very difficult financially and risky artistically to program music that is outside of the standard classical musical canon. The Orchestre classique de Montréal, deeply appreciative of the rich musical traditions of Ukraine, wanted to share this incredible music with the Montréal public, a public that despite the cultural richness of Montréal, does not often get the chance to hear works by geniuses like Myroslav Skoryk, Mykola Lysenko, or contemporary Ukrainian-Canadian composer Larysa Kuzmenko.

Our concert “**Echoes of the Steppes**,” presented in February 2022 just a week before the war began, was so well-received that the OCM was invited to present the concert once again, this time in Ottawa as part of the Music and Beyond Festival in July 2022, sharing Ukrainian classical music with a new public.

Without the support of the Shevchenko Foundation and its generous donors, we would not have been able to take this successful financial and artistic risk. We are grateful to count them as a partner in helping us share the beauty and richness of Ukrainian culture across all of Canada.

Art is Power

Art has the power to transform, to educate, and to inspire.

Edmonton-based theatre artist Lianna Makuch continues to demonstrate this power through her evolving evocative work in theatre.

We were first introduced to Lianna as she was developing her one-woman play, *Blood of our Soil* – a personal story of war and trauma inspired by her grandparents that depicts the historic struggles of the Ukrainian people while drawing disturbing parallels to today's reality.

Since then, she has been awarded the REACH Mentorship/Residency for the Arts grant to adapt her acclaimed play *Blood of Our Soil* into a feature-length screenplay. After 20 public theatre performances and international recognition, you can now follow its development under a new title, *Barvinok*.

Lianna's most recent play was inspired by a residency with the IZOLYATSIA Cultural Institute in Kyiv, Ukraine, where she met a 19-year-old volunteer Ukrainian combat medic who left everything behind to go to the front line of one of the deadliest battles of the war in Eastern Ukraine in 2015 — the battle for the Donetsk Airport. Lianna tells her story in *Alina* which premiered in Edmonton in spring 2022.

Inspired by her Ukrainian heritage, the actor/playwright/director firmly believes that artists have an advantage and responsibility to share the human stories that can be universally understood.

"So much of our identity is encapsulated in culture and the arts. It's more important than ever to be a Ukrainian artist in light of the blatant attempt to erase Ukrainian culture," states Lianna. "It's our role to help preserve and create the emotional experiences that evoke empathy and inspire engagement."

A graduate of the BFA Acting Program at the University of Alberta, Lianna is also dedicated to her community. Locally, she co-founded Spark! Youth Camp which provides affordable arts education for youth in Edmonton's Alberta Avenue Community. Internationally, she actively supports volunteers in Ukraine in their continuing fight.

What does the future hold? Lianna is currently directing a play – *First Métis Man of Odesa*, that will tour nationally in 2023. *Barvinok* will be touring in fall 2022. *Alina* will see further development. And Lianna's also developing theatre for young audiences featuring the Ukrainian Métis tale by Saskatchewan writer Marion Mutala. (And these are just the highlights!)



Further down the road she hopes to help create more opportunities for collaboration with Ukrainian artists.

"We will continue to do our work, fight this fight in every way we know, and keep Ukraine in people's minds with a full season of Ukrainian-based theatre," Lianna affirms.

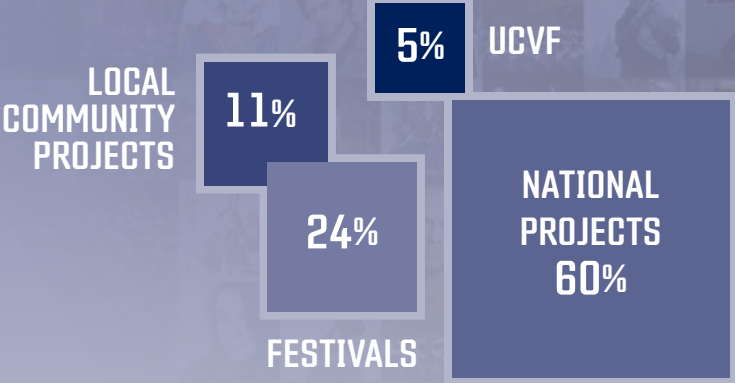

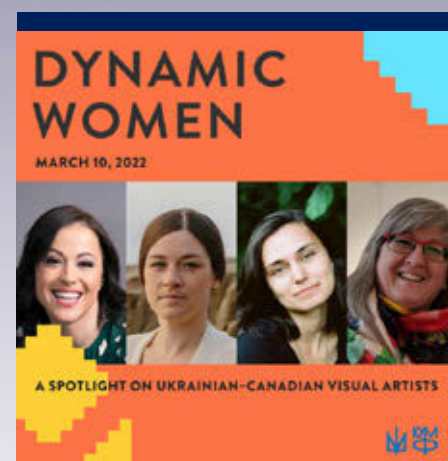

“SVI not only survived but thrived during the pandemic. The online programming offered more people an opportunity to reconnect with their community and their roots with participants from outside the city and even the country,” said Executive Director Daria Kowalyk.

Quickly understanding the opportunity as presented, SVI set out to increase awareness of its facility as more than just a student residence. SVI strives to be a hub of Ukrainian community activities and a leading Canadian resource centre for teaching, learning and advancing Ukrainian and Ukrainian Canadian culture.

Online presentations celebrated Ukrainian and Canadian personalities. The culinary series offered a great opportunity to hone Ukrainian cooking skills. Folk art classes highlighted the beauty and diversity of our culture. Film screenings shared stories of our identity.

Taking advantage of the building’s large windows facing a very busy city street, SVI mounted a public arts initiative — Old Souls / New Dreams — in conjunction with Culture Days, a national celebration of arts and culture. Guelph, Ontario, visual artist Taras Lachowsky was invited to animate the local neighbourhood by displaying his vibrant artwork inspired by *Vytynanky* (traditional Ukrainian paper cut-outs) on the windows for every passerby to enjoy.

Most of the events were free of charge, although fundraisers were also part of the programming mix.



As the community slowly returns to in-person events, SVI will be looking for ways to strike a balance between hosting events at its prime downtown facility while offering a virtual component for those who have now gratefully discovered a way to stay connected.

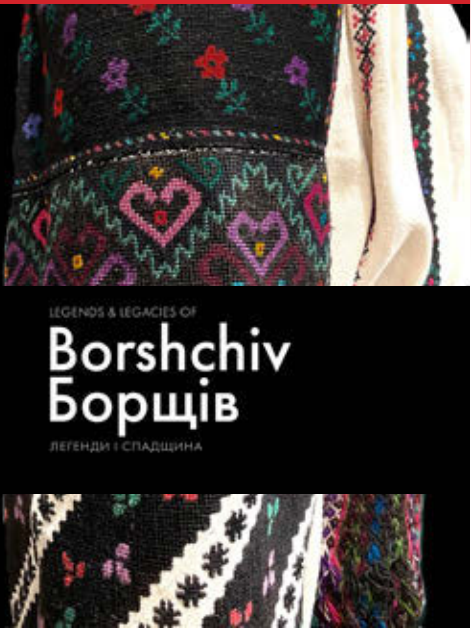
The Borshchiv Legacy

In the Borshchiv region, customs and traditions were based on the religious and seasonal calendars. The seasonal calendar determined the annual cycle of activities related to the harvest year. Everyday agricultural activities like ploughing and planting called for simpler clothing, especially when it came to the sorochka (chemise). These sorochky were modestly embroidered, if at all, and were worn by farmers who also served their communities as weavers, masons, shoemakers, and blacksmiths in the off-seasons.

Occasions such as church attendance, holidays, and feast days called for an exceptional sorochka. The black-embroidered sorochka, known for the richness of the embroidery created from black sheep's wool, has drawn the attention of many collectors in Ukraine and the diaspora.

Created by the Ihnatowycz Family Foundation in partnership with the Shevchenko Foundation, the program encourages emerging Canadian artists to reach for their career dreams by seeking opportunities for mentorship, residency, internship, and training.

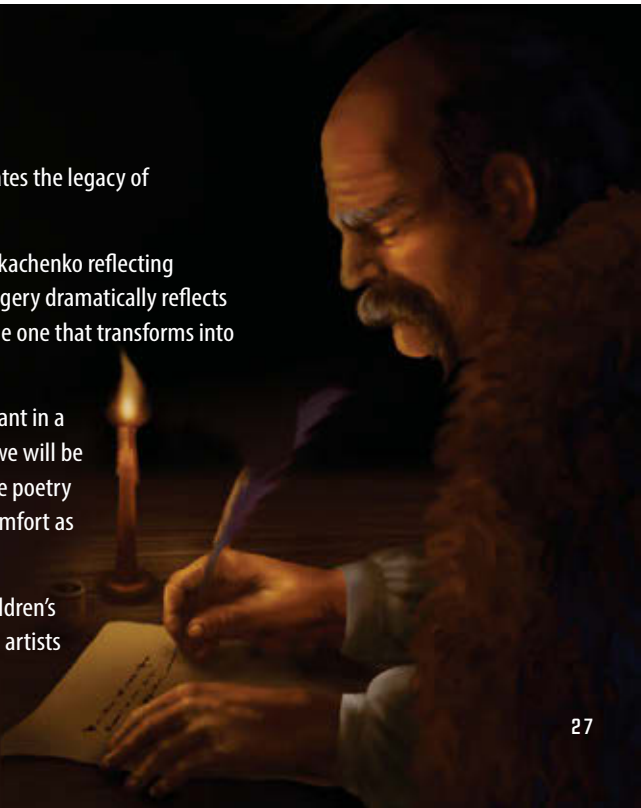
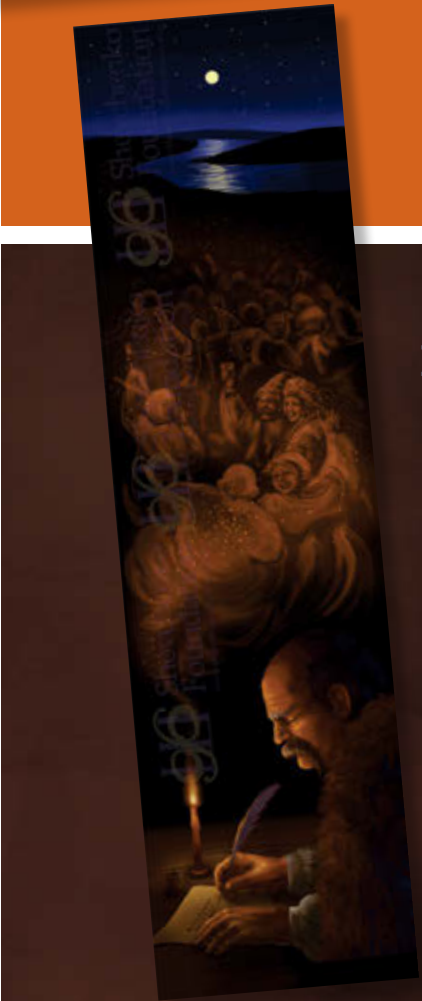
INSPIRING UNIQUE STRENGTH

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

On behalf of the Endowment Council of the Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund (CFWWIRF), I am pleased to present an overview of completed and ongoing First World War internment grant projects for the fiscal year 2021-2022. Once again, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a few projects were either not able to be completed on time or were withdrawn. The Endowment Council is now working hard at prioritizing projects to be completed in this last year of the CFWWIRF mandate.

The Endowment Council held a total of ten formal meetings via conference/video call. As a result of these consultations, 17 grants were approved, totalling \$1,006,636.

Since the inception of the CFWWIRF, the Endowment Council has awarded \$5,237,587 in grants. The approved grants have funded various projects, including historical exhibits, books, commemorative plaques/statues, films, historical research, artistic endeavours, and educational resources, including virtual and augmented reality exhibits.

Over this past fiscal year (2021-2022), the world class Canadian Museum of History officially opened the exhibit, *Lost Liberties, The War Measures Act*, funded in large part by the CFWWIRF. The National Internment Art exhibit, *Pause in Plight* by Winnipeg artist Kerri Parnell continues its cross Canada tour. Another amazing project was the development of an interactive Internment Walking Tour App by On This Spot for the British Columbia internment camp sites.

As the initial agreement with the Government of Canada concludes in 2023, our focus is on a smooth transition to the Shevchenko Foundation that remains committed to ensuring that the funds will continue to support many new and innovative projects that further raise awareness of this tragic period in our nation's history.

OTHER NOTABLE INITIATIVES IN PROGRESS:

- The Endowment Council is working towards the transfer of the administration of the internment program to the Shevchenko Foundation upon the conclusion of the initial agreement with the Government of Canada in May 2023.
- The Endowment Council continues its consultations with the Canadian Museum of History about an expanded artefact loan agreement for the cataloguing, preservation and exhibition of the CFWWIRF's internee artefacts.
- The Endowment Council continues its efforts for Canada Post to introduce a commemorative stamp or a series of stamps commemorating Canada's first national internment operations.
- Work continues to complete Project 107, providing new headstones and monuments for all 107 internees who died while incarcerated.
- Work continues to complete Project Roll Call, an online database of all 8,579 internees.
- The Endowment Council is working closely with the Shevchenko Foundation on a knowledge portal to facilitate ongoing efficient access to information on Canada's first national internment operation.

CELEBRATING CULTURE IN ALL ITS DIVERSITY

The legacy of Zena and Leon Kossar

Zena and Leon Kossar had a vision. They believed that Canada’s strength lay in its diverse ethnocultural communities and their life’s work was devoted to strengthening and celebrating our cultural mosaic.

Both Zena and Leon were born into Ukrainian immigrant families in Arran and Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, respectively. They met, however, in Toronto, Ontario, where they embarked on a journey that would forever change the face of the city, making it a global role model for multiculturalism.

As a reporter, Leon wrote about the many cultural communities that formed with the influx of European immigrants after the world wars. Noticing the isolation of these communities, Zena came up with a creative solution to build bridges with a celebration of cultures. This solution in 1969 became the annual Metro International Caravan, a popular week-long festival that showcased the food, music, and cultural traditions of Toronto’s immigrant population. The festival had a 35-year run with Leon and Zena at the helm until Leon’s death in 2001. At its peak it featured more than 50 pavilions and attracted close to two million visitors each year. By the mid-1970s, Caravan had become Toronto’s calling card and garnered international media attention with coverage in *Time* magazine, *National Geographic*, *Washington Post* and *New York Times*.

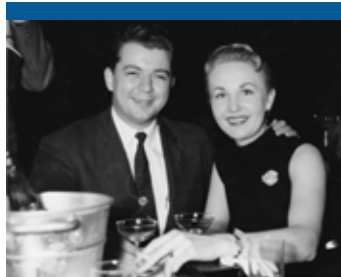
An elegant, sharp-witted, determined woman, Zena loved music, food, and conversation. She never complained about hardship and embraced every day as a blessing. Her energy and excitement inspired many of the tremendous achievements of this inseparable couple including a Canadian National Exhibition cultural extravaganza over 12 seasons titled *Nationbuilders* and the organization of special performing groups that represented Canada at the Mexico and Montreal Summer Olympic Games. Zena maintained her positive outlook and intense curiosity about life until her death in 2019.

Zena and Leon Kossar shared a love for music, particularly choral and Ukrainian liturgical music. Leon studied music and became a proficient musician. He sang, arranged music and was one of several conductors of the Ukrainian National Federation’s Winnipeg community choir which subsequently evolved into the famed Olexander Koshetz Choir.

The **Leon and Zena Kossar Music Fund** established with a bequest from the late Zena Kossar will honour the shared passion of its benefactors in perpetuity by supporting projects that help future generations experience their heritage and celebrate their identity through the power of music. May their legacy continue to inspire the values of inclusivity and cultural pride among future generations of Ukrainian Canadians.

The Shevchenko Foundation (TSF) congratulates former president Dr. Roman Petryshyn on being invested as a Member of the Order of Canada on December 29, 2021.

Roman Petryshyn was the founding director of the Ukrainian Resource and Development Centre at Grant MacEwan University where he held the Drs. Peter and Doris Kule Chair in Ukrainian Community and International Development until 2015.

Roman Petryshyn is best known for his visionary projects. With a very clear understanding of the potential of the Ukrainian community in Canada he was an advocate of multiculturalism and promoted organizations that would strengthen the role of our community in Canadian society and abroad.

For six years Roman Petryshyn served as a director of TSF, three of those years as its president from 1994-1996.

New Strategies for a Volatile Market

This being my third annual report, I now firmly believe there is no such thing as normal.

A year ago, I commented on the surplus of capital in the market that, combined with low interest rates, was creating a perfect storm. Too much money was driving the investment markets and real estate valuations too high.

In the last few years, we witnessed the speed with which vaccines were developed and distributed in North America and Europe. The vaccine was accompanied by massive government financial stimuli. This accelerated consumer spending in the developed world and drove product demand. However, in the developing parts of the world, the primary source of manufacturing, the vaccines and stimuli did not come as quickly, resulting in shortages of supply.

In 2021, product shortages and high levels of consumer activity resulted in “transitory inflation.” It was anticipated that once manufacturing and transportation caught up with the demand, inflation would return to normal levels.

Then came labour shortages, followed by the war in Ukraine. These events exasperated inflation by increasing labour costs and creating even more shortages in important commodities needed in the manufacturing process. We will also see an impact on world food supply and prices.

As a result, today we have inflation rates that we have not seen in 40 years and, if history gives us any indication, inflation and slower economic activity may be with us for a while. This is not good news for the markets.

Governments have responded by increasing their lending rates and starting to contract the money supply. This is reversing the policies that contributed to this problem originally.

For the year ended March 31, 2022, the rate of return on the total portfolio was 5.6% compared to 21.9% for 2021.

As of the time of writing this report the major indices in the US and globally are in bear markets, down more than 20%. From March 31 to the end of June our portfolio has fallen 8.8%. Much of this drag on our performance is the result of our international equity market allocation. We continue to monitor the investment managers’ performance in this area.

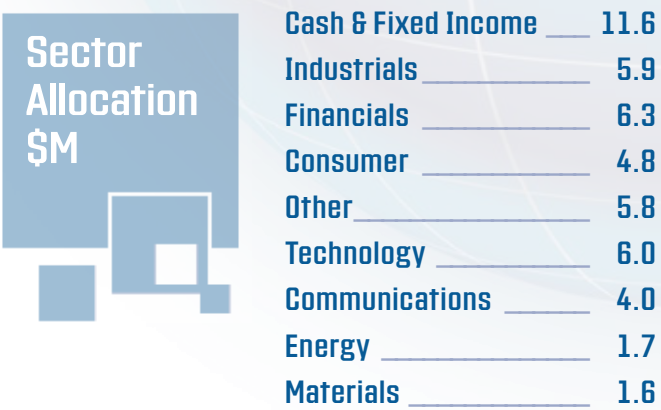
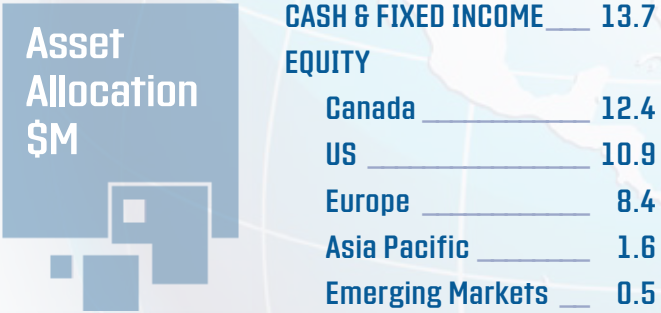
In anticipation of more market volatility, over a year ago we began looking to add alternative investment strategies to the portfolio. After several strategy sessions and interviews with alternative investment managers, we have now identified and approved new investments in real estate and infrastructure as additions to the Foundation’s asset mix. We anticipate that these investments will help us navigate some of the issues we see in the market.

We thank the Foundation Board for its ongoing support. The Investment Committee is committed to stewarding the investments of the Shevchenko Foundation diligently and professionally.

Finally, I thank the members of the Shevchenko Foundation Investment Committee for their hard work during this past year. I am very lucky to work with this team and the Foundation is fortunate to have such a talented Investment Committee.

The summary financial statements and the audited financial statements do not reflect the effects of events that occurred subsequent to the date of our report on the audited financial statements.
