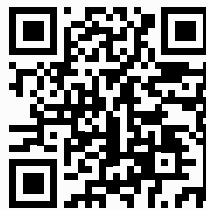

Sixty years ago, a small group of community leaders envisioned a support system for the thriving Ukrainian cultural legacy in Canada. Their vision of a permanent endowment fund was about much more than self-preservation. It was about shaping a future.

In 2023-24, The Shevchenko Foundation (TSF) further amplified its commitment to building community and fueling artistic creativity by awarding over \$1.2 million in grants, program funding, and community support.

We awarded the 10th Kobzar Book Award, became sole stewards of the multi-million-dollar Internment Legacy Fund, and, in partnership with the Canada-Ukraine Foundation, assisted displaced Ukrainian students with their studies in Canada. We celebrated the recognition of our artists on Canadian and international stages. We were pleased to welcome new grantees to the TSF family and to support the development of new communities with its challenges and opportunities.

To reflect our dynamic growth, TSF introduced a refreshed brand. With its sleek, contemporary design it is both an acknowledgement of the accomplished past and recognition of an exciting future.


На жаль, війна проти України не припиняється. Але, виконуючи свою місію, Фундація є вірним амбасадором України, її народу і культури.

60 YEARS OF “Thought And Purposeful Work”

THE BEGINNINGS

The importance of establishing a solid and permanent financial support system to further the goals of the community was on the radar of visionary community leaders as early as the 1950s.

When the Ukrainian community in Canada embarked on a significant undertaking in 1959 – to place a monument to Taras Shevchenko, Ukraine’s national poet, on the grounds of the Manitoba Legislature, the idea had crystallized. Two years later, on July 9, 1961, nearly 25,000 Ukrainian Canadians from across the country gathered in Winnipeg to witness Prime Minister John G. Diefenbaker officially unveil the monument.

Of the \$175,000 raised for this endeavour, \$30,000 was invested into an endowment fund dedicated to the preservation and development of Ukrainian culture in Canada – the Ukrainian Canadian Foundation of Taras Shevchenko.

“ 26,100 donors from hundreds of villages, small towns, and large cities, made their gift in support of building the Monument to our father-Taras and subconsciously laid the foundation for the next structure that will live and work even when we are gone.

This structure is the million-dollar Taras Shevchenko Foundation. ...This will be our assistance-lifeline for studying youth, for Ukrainian organizations and institutions that will include all Ukrainians in the preservation of cultural and historical legacies, and in documenting for posterity our efforts, work, and achievements in Canada.

The T. Shevchenko Foundation is not only about money for the future. It is also a foundation of thought and systematic and purposeful work. ”

Our Impact – Your Legacy

Since inception in 1963, The Shevchenko Foundation (TSF) has been dedicated to building community, fueling creativity, and inspiring philanthropy. We continually nurture cultural connections that span generations, enriching the lives of countless individuals and strengthening the Ukrainian Canadian identity.

Staying true to building and managing a permanent endowment fund, earned income is reinvested into the community in one of several ways.

Grants awarded in four pillars of activity:

Arts, Community Development, Heritage and Education

Program Funding in support of artistic endeavours

Community Support through sponsorships and advertising

Continuing the new stream of funding created in 2022–23, we supported initiatives welcoming newcomers from Ukraine to our communities. This included a successful partnership with the Canada-Ukraine Foundation through which we provided bursaries for displaced Ukrainian students studying in Canada.

Thanks to your support and partnership, in 2023–24 TSF allocated record financial support for the powerful Ukrainian Canadian brand!

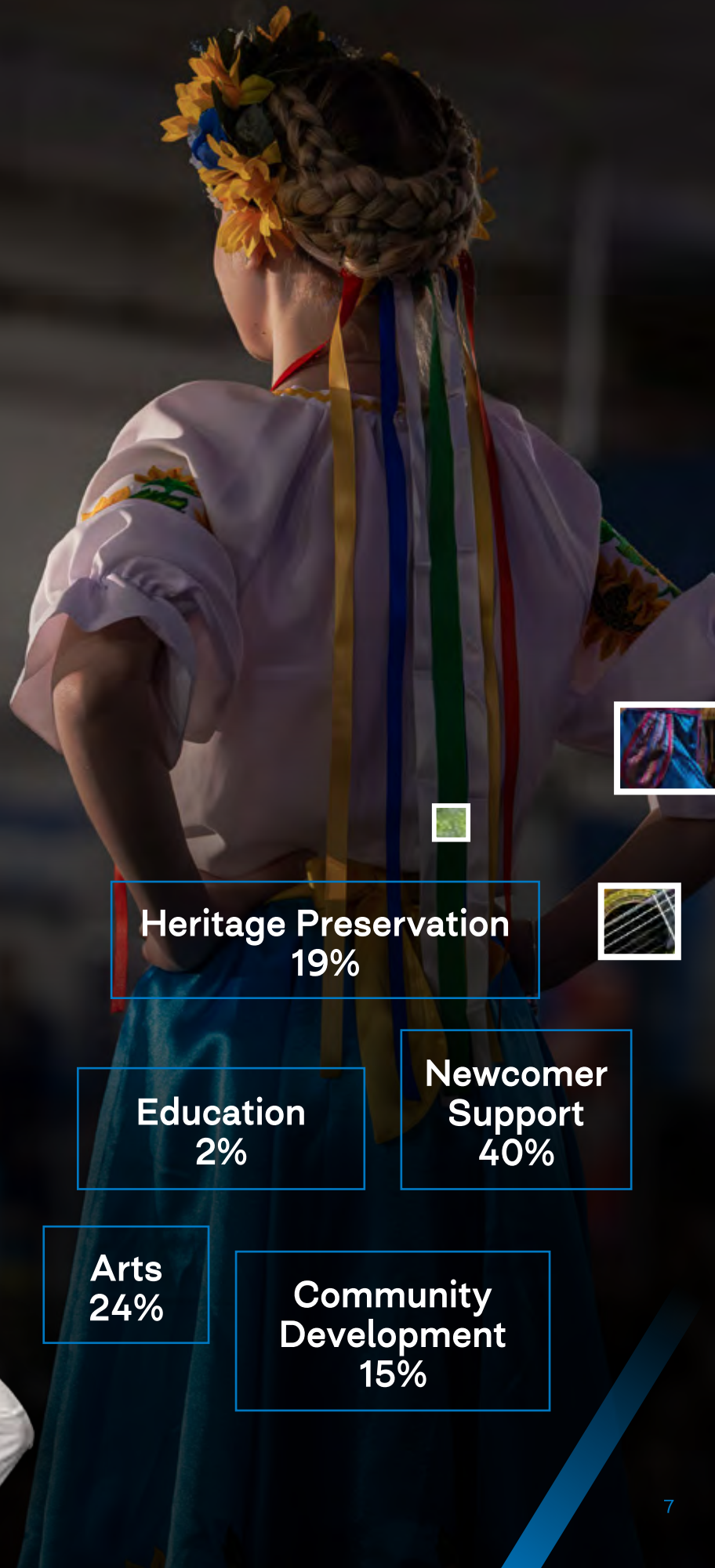

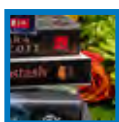

The **Lastivka Bandura Capella** of Thunder Bay, Ontario, was formed by local bandurist Lisa Klymenko. Having played the bandura in her youth, Lisa has taught individual musicians over the years. More recently, the influx of newcomers from Ukraine presented an opportunity to form a collective.

Lisa is very proud of the capella with eight bandurists – the most ever in Thunder Bay. They range in age from 9 to 67 years old and have varying levels of music experience. The capella looks forward to expanding its repertoire and sharing the sounds of the bandura with music lovers throughout the city.

The **Ukrainian Theatre Group** in Halifax, Nova Scotia, leverages the wealth of theatrical experience among recent Ukrainian immigrants and the existing community by staging professional productions of classic and contemporary Ukrainian theatre.

The group has adapted traditional content to modern sensibilities and developed popular immersive cultural experiences that have been enjoyed by hundreds of theatregoers in different communities throughout the province.

We look forward to watching them soar!

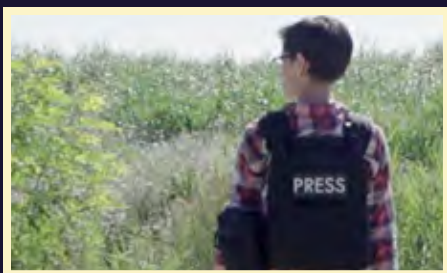
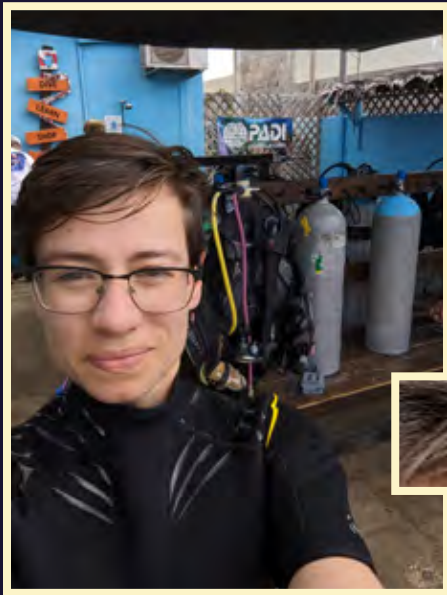

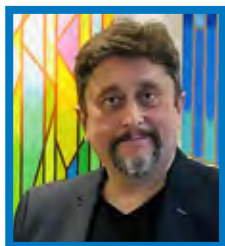

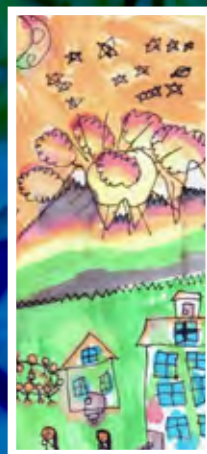
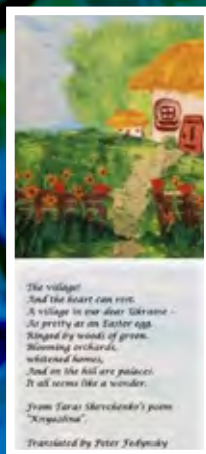
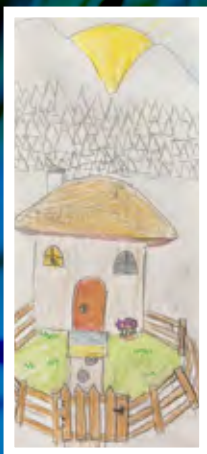
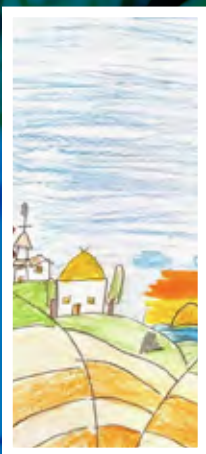
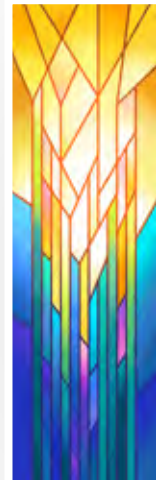


SHARING THE LIGHT OF TRUTH

As the world marked 210 years since the birth of Taras Shevchenko on March 9, 1814, we honoured our namesake – Ukrainian national poet and artist – with an original bookmark that has become a long-standing tradition.

This year's inspiring design by Toronto-based artist **Denys Golden** is titled *Light the world of truth*. It reminds us that we, too, can be this light of truth, as referenced in Taras Shevchenko's poem *Subotiv*, that the world so desperately needs during these challenging times in which we live.

Thousands of copies of the annual bookmark are distributed at no cost to Ukrainian children across Canada.

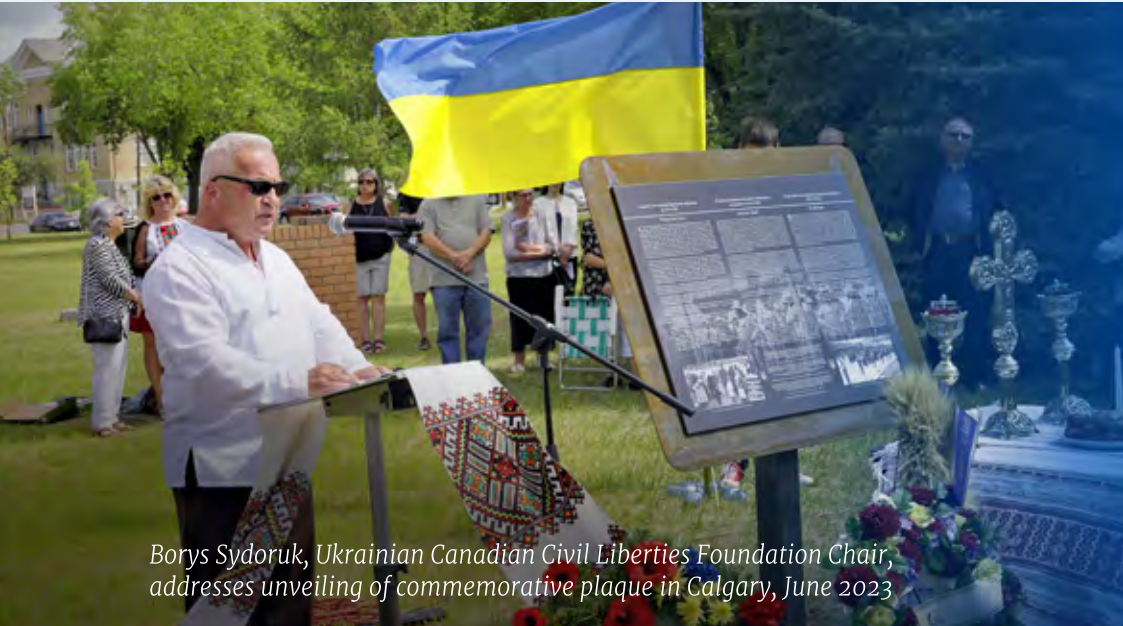

UCVF funds projects that promote the Ukrainian Canadian community and the furthering of citizenship and public service. The UCVF became a TSF designated fund in 2018.

Internment Legacy Honours Mission

Thousands of men, women, and children were branded as “enemy aliens” and detained during Canada’s first national internment operations of 1914 to 1920.

In 2008, the Federal Government of Canada established a \$10 million endowment known as the “Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund” (CFWWIRF) to commemorate and educate Canadians about Canada’s first national internment operations. Since inception, the CFWWIRF awarded close to \$6 million in grants in support of a wide range of projects.

Upon the expiration of the funding agreement with the Federal Government in 2023, the Canadian WWI Internment Legacy – a program of The Shevchenko Foundation – was created to succeed and continue the work of the CFWWIRF.

The Internment Legacy acknowledges the work of numerous community stakeholders, including the Ukrainian Canadian Congress and the Ukrainian Canadian Civil Liberties Association, in establishing the endowment and reflects the commitment of TSF to honour the mission for which it was established.

Through the Internment Legacy, TSF will continue to support projects that commemorate and recognize the experiences of ethnocultural communities affected by the First World War internment and address the ongoing harm resulting from this unjust internment.



ABOUT OUR LOGO

The new logo of the Canadian WWI Internment Legacy incorporates the image of the monument titled “VYTRYVALIST – ENDURANCE” designed by Alberta artist Herman Poulin.

This monument was the initiative of the Ukrainian Canadian Civil Liberties Foundation, and funded in part by the CFWWIRF and its successor, the Internment Legacy Fund.

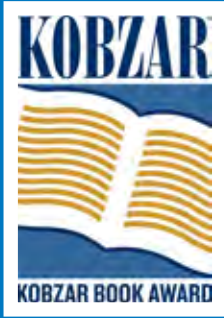
Endurance was unveiled on October 1, 2023, at the Alberta Legislature Grounds in Edmonton, Alberta.

Celebrating Canadian Stories

The 10th KOBZAR™ Book Award Presentation was a great success with 150 guests from across Canada gathering on March 21, 2024, at Winnipeg's Canadian Museum for Human Rights to celebrate our Canadian storytellers.

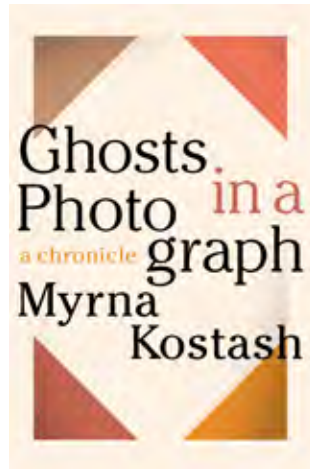
The Ukrainian story in Canada spans over 130 years from the first settlers in 1891 to today's newly arrived Ukrainians displaced by the war in their homeland. TSF launched the Kobzar Book Award (KBA) with a mission to encourage writers to interpret our Ukrainian Canadian stories boldly and creatively for the world to enjoy.

Six titles were shortlisted for the \$25,000 prize which is at the core of the TSF literary arts program.

The 2024 KBA was presented to acclaimed Edmonton-based writer Myrna Kostash for her chronicle *Ghosts in a Photograph*. The memoir delves into the lives of the author's grandparents, all of whom moved from Galicia, now present-day Ukraine, to Alberta at the turn of the twentieth century.

Ukrainians and friends of Ukraine gathered at the Art Gallery of Ontario in Toronto on May 9, 2024, for the Tryzub Awards Gala in a show of solidarity with the people of Ukraine. 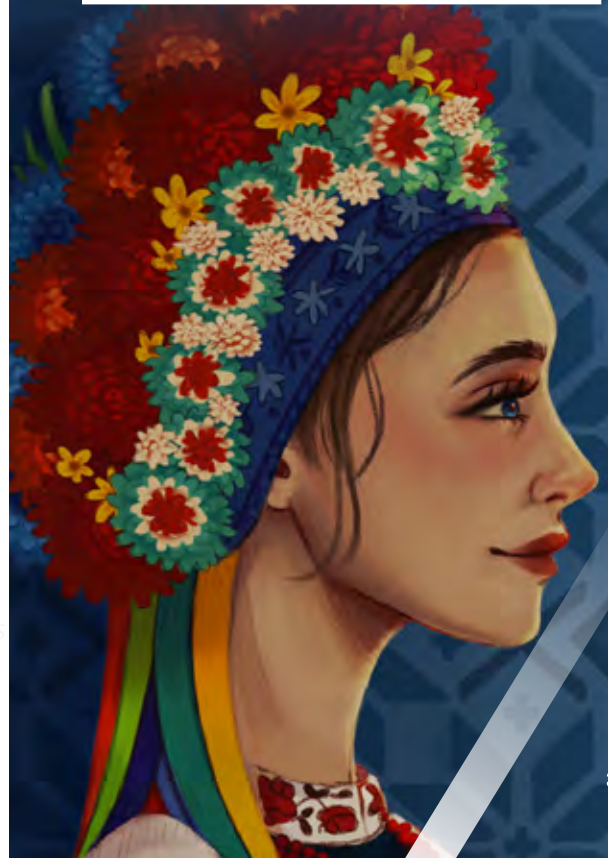
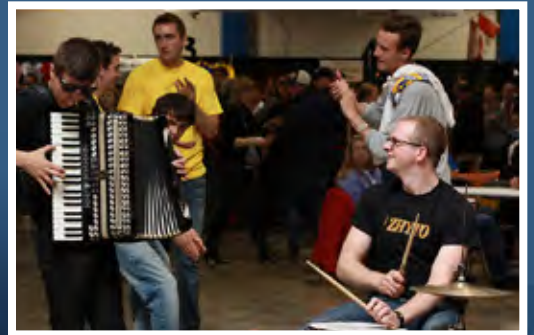

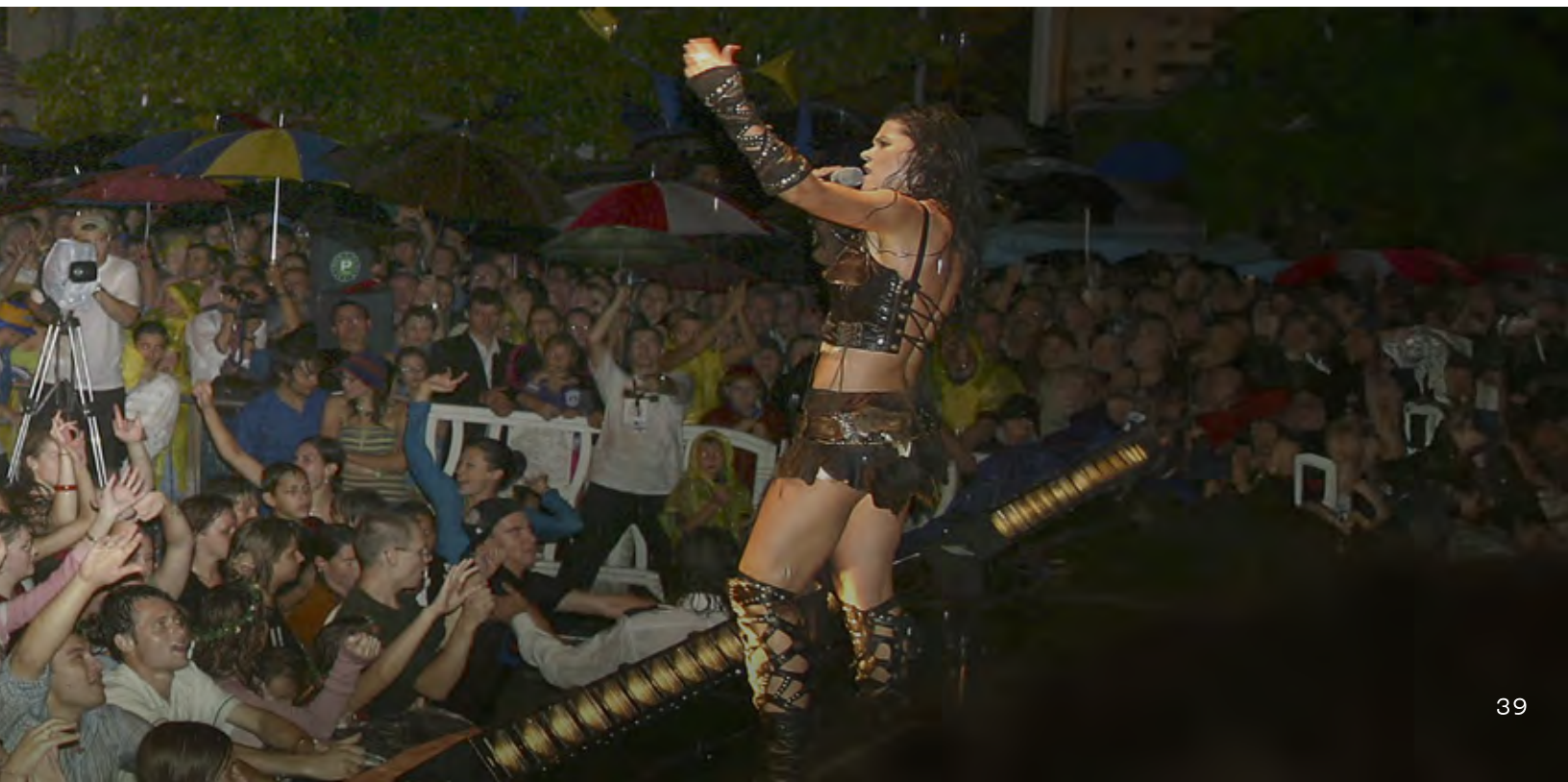




The **Bloor West Village Toronto Ukrainian Festival** was inaugurated as the Ukrainian Canadian community's response to the City of Toronto's call for the revival of a 1991 Twinning Agreement between Toronto and Kyiv, Ukraine.

The Organizing Committee's vision is to offer the largest celebration of Ukrainian spirit in the world. Over 1 million visitors from across Canada and the US attended the 3-day festival in 2023 to enjoy true Ukrainian hospitality and a total family experience.

“ It is more vital today, than ever, to keep Ukraine visible and the importance of its independence to the global community in the forefront. The Bloor West Village Ukrainian Festival has immersed over 15 million visitors since 1997 in Ukrainian history and culture, continues to share the beauty of Ukraine while promoting the contribution of Ukrainians to the fabric of Canada as a whole. ”



TSF History Highlights

1963 - "An Act to Incorporate the Ukrainian Canadian Foundation of Taras Shevchenko" was successfully introduced in the Canadian Parliament through the efforts of Senators John Hnatyshyn, William Wall, and Paul Yuzyk, and Member of Parliament Nicholas Mandziuk, and signed on July 22 by Governor General G.P. Vanier.



1964 - The Shevchenko Foundation was officially launched with the appointment by the Ukrainian Canadian Congress (UCC) of the first Board of Directors with Dr. Isydore Hlynka at the helm.

1965 - The first large grant of \$5,000 is awarded to UCC for the publication of 3 books: *The Ukrainian Poets 1189-1962*, and *The Poetical Works of Taras Shevchenko*, both translated by C.H. Andrusyshen and Watson Kirkconnell, and *Taras Shevchenko: The Artist* by Ivan Keywan.

1968 - The first large single grant of \$5,000 is awarded in support of the development of audio-visual methodology and materials for teaching Ukrainian language in public schools.

1973 - \$92,000 awarded in grants during first decade.

1978 - Assets reach first **\$1,000,000.**

1983 - \$886,000 awarded in grants during second decade.

1987 - TSF receives its first designated fund from Stefan and Maria Yankowski of Winnipeg, MB.

1993 - \$1,549,000 awarded in grants during third decade.

1994 - An Investment Committee is appointed by the Board of Directors.



1997 - President Andriy Hladyshevsky, K.C., initiates the Kobzar Fellowship Program. The first 11 members of the Kobzar Fellowship are inducted in 1998 in Saskatoon.

2002 - The first Shevchenko bilingual Bookmark "Educate Yourself, my Brethren" is issued.

2003 - \$2,472,000 awarded in grants during fourth decade.

2004 - *A Legacy of Ukrainian Dance* is unveiled during Congress of Ukrainian Canadians.





2005 - The John Synnack Journalism Award is launched and presented to Mark MacKinnon of *The Globe & Mail* for his coverage of the Orange Revolution.

2006 - The first Kobzar™ Literary Award of \$25,000 is presented to Danny Schur for *STRIKE! The Musical* and to Laura Langston for *Lesia's Dream*.

2019 - Theatre artist Andrew Kushnir of Toronto receives the inaugural REACH Mentorship/Residency for the Arts.



2019 - Fifty students from Ukraine take part in the Mitacs Global Link Internship program.

2019 - Inaugural Tryzub Awards Gala held at Art Gallery of Ontario.

2020 - Tanya Berezuk wins the inaugural Shevchenko Foundation Emerging Writers Short Prose Competition.

2021 - TSF initiates special support measures for grant applicants affected by the Covid-19 pandemic.

2021 - Assets surpass **\$30,000,000**

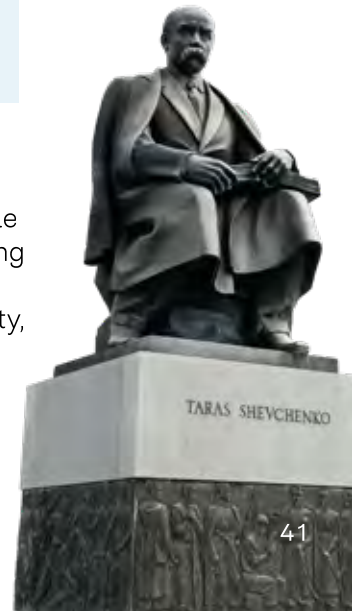
2022 - In response to the unprovoked war by Russia against Ukraine, TSF introduced special grants designed to assist the community in welcoming Ukrainians to Canada displaced by the war.

2023 - Upon the expiration of the funding agreement with the Federal Government, the Canadian WWI Internment Legacy was created to succeed and continue the work of the CFWWIRF.

2023 - \$3,733,000 awarded in grants during sixth decade.

2024 - disbursed in grants **Record \$1,000,000**

2024 - On its 60th anniversary, TSF introduced a new logo that pays tribute to TSF's history while celebrating the pillars of a growing multi-million-dollar organization that inspires innovation, inclusivity, and excellence. A \$600,000 campaign was launched to celebrate the milestone.



2008 - The Federal Government of Canada established a **\$10 million endowment** known as the "Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund" (CFWWIRF).

2008 - Assets surpass **\$5,000,000**

2013 - \$3,084,000 awarded in grants during fifth decade.

2014 - Assets surpass \$20,000,000

2016 - Launch of capital campaign "Our Legacy, Our Tomorrow"

2018 - Ukrainian Canadian Veterans Fund becomes a TSF designated fund.

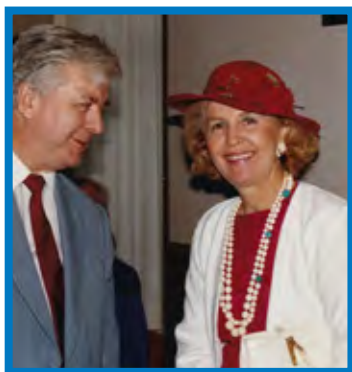


BORIS HORODYNSKY FOUNDATION

ZENA KOSSAR ESTATE

Leon and Zena Kossar believed that Canada's strength lay in its diverse multicultural communities. In 1969 they founded the annual Metro International Caravan, a popular week-long festival that showcased the cultural traditions of Toronto's diverse communities, forever changing the face of the city. Leon and Zena also shared a love for music, particularly Ukrainian liturgical and choral music. The Leon and Zena Kossar Music Fund was established in 2021 with a gift from the estate of the late Zena Kossar to honour the passion of its benefactors in perpetuity. The Fund supports projects that help generations celebrate their identity through the power of music.



PAWLO LYCHKUN FARM ESTATE

Pawlo Lychkun was a Manitoba farmer who greatly valued the community's work with youth. As a result, he gifted his estate for the collective benefit of three provincial organizations – Ukrainian Youth Association (CYM), Plast Ukrainian Youth Association, and Canadian Ukrainian Youth Association (SUMK). Upon the sale of the assets that were not to be divided, the three organizations invested the proceeds with TSF in 2020 and created the Pawlo Lychkun Memorial Fund from which they will benefit in perpetuity.

A Philanthropic Legacy

Peter Kule was born in Ukraine and emigrated to Canada in 1938, settling in Two Hills, Alberta. He went on to become a successful entrepreneur. Peter married Doris Radesh, an educator, who predeceased Peter in 2020.

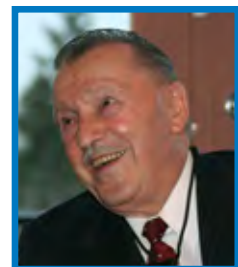
In retirement, wishing to give back to their community, Peter and Doris Kule turned their attention to philanthropic activities. They understood the value of education and deeply respected the contribution of Ukrainians to Canada throughout history. These principles, coupled with a desire to help young Canadians succeed, guided their philanthropy.

At the University of Alberta they made an impact with the establishment of the Peter and Doris Kule Centre for Ukrainian and Canadian Folklore, the Kule Ukrainian Canadian Studies Centre at the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies (CIUS), and the Kule Institute for Advanced Study (KIAS).

The Kules' philanthropic vision was extended to MacEwan University with the establishment of the Drs. Peter & Doris Kule Chair of Ukrainian Community & International Development, and the Visiting Scholars in Ukrainian Studies and Culture Fund. At the University of Ottawa, the Kules established the Doctoral Scholarship on Contemporary Ukraine.

Their deep commitment to the Church and Eastern Christian theology and spirituality was realized with The Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky Institute Foundation Kule Family Endowment.

As generous supporters, Peter and Doris Kule understood the role of TSF in developing and promoting the Ukrainian Canadian narrative. A TSF scholarship will be established in their memory.

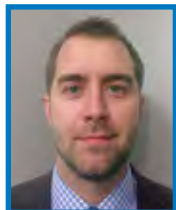

Investment Committee Report

YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 2024

Our investment returns for the year ended March 31, 2024, were driven by the tale of two markets. From the first day of our current fiscal year through the end of October 2023 the market showed a slow and steady decline. November's return reversed the first 6 months' losses and took our portfolio positive for the year. The markets have continued to climb through March and beyond.

The culprits for the tale of two markets were interest rates and inflation.

The bell weather measure for interest rates is the U.S. 10-year treasury rate. Between April and October, this rate increased from approximately 3.5% to around 5.0%, with investors fearing that the "war" against inflation wasn't going as well as anticipated. The markets, not liking higher interest rates, steadily fell.

In the last week of October, the 10-year treasury rate fell from 5% to approximately 4.6%, and inflation fell 0.01%. The markets took this as a sign that the interest rates were about to fall, and inflation was coming under control. Around this time the pundits started predicting up to 6 rate cuts for 2024 and the markets got excited. As of the end of June 2024, the U.S. had not cut rates and Canada had initiated one 0.25% rate cut. Still the markets continued to increase.

The Shevchenko Foundation's (TSF) total portfolio return was slightly under 12% for the year ended March 31, 2024. Coupled with positive net contributions, our total fund approached a market valuation of just below \$55 million, a new record high.

The market returns have been largely influenced by tech stocks. TSF's performance was positive as the result of a well-balanced portfolio.

Looking forward, the concern is that the heavy global investment in "artificial intelligence" (AI) is driving the valuation of a small group of tech stocks which in turn has been driving the headline market performance. The pricing of these tech stocks is more driven by share prices outpacing earnings growth.

The annual global investment in AI is estimated to be in the \$800 million to \$1 trillion range and it is difficult to predict to what extent this oversized investment is driving oversized “real” returns.

From TSF’s perspective, investment portfolio diversification and the new investment in the Brookfield Infrastructure Fund, which is targeted at profiting from the build out investment in AI, should help mitigate future volatility in the market.

The Investment Committee is changing the asset allocation to accommodate the large real estate and infrastructure private equity investments that we referred to in last year’s report. The Real Estate Fund has been fully funded and we have partially funded our Infrastructure investment. This year we are taking a hard look at the fixed income part of the portfolio, approximately 20% of TSF assets, to see if there is an opportunity to improve TSF’s returns.

TSF is also finishing an extensive review of its tax and security compliance. This, along with the new charitable rules that require a 5% annual distribution, will continue to have an impact on TSF’s investment strategy.

TSF’s size gives it a distinct advantage in sourcing the investment and professional advisors to help it develop strategies to deal with these changes.

Finally, I would like to thank our Investment Committee for its hard work this year. The TSF Investment Committee has the capability, diverse background, and the investment experience to provide a level of oversight that, as benefactors of The Shevchenko Foundation, we are fortunate to have.

In our report dated June 21, 2024, we expressed an unqualified audit opinion on the financial statements.


