Inspiring the Future

As The Shevchenko Foundation (TSF) wrapped up its 60th anniversary celebrations and stepped into a new decade, we took advantage of the opportunity to review the vision, mission, and overall strategic direction of the organization to ensure our continued growth and prosperity.

In 2024–25, TSF distributed close to \$1.1 million in grants and community sponsorships supporting organizations and individuals across Canada dedicated to the arts, community development, education, and heritage preservation. An additional \$285,780 was reinvested into the community with income generated by donor–designated funds.

A dynamic, ever–growing community and innovative artists aspiring to excellence continue to inspire us. While our mission remains unchanged, we will focus on strengthening existing and building new partnerships, refining processes to improve transparency and efficiency, and exploring untapped markets for the Ukrainian Canadian story.

In this Annual Report we highlight the work of our Ukrainian museums and heritage institutions. These institutions are invaluable as keepers of our heritage and traditions, and as our historical and cultural compass – all of which provide the solid foundation on which we continue to build.

As Ukrainians are forced to sacrifice lives to prevent erasure of the Ukrainian identity, we must assume greater responsibility for upholding the cultural front. This significant role Ukrainian Canadians continue to play was underscored by President of Ukraine Volodymyr Zelensky who, during his June visit to Canada, expressed gratitude on behalf of the Ukrainian people for our community’s commitment to safeguarding Ukrainian cultural heritage.

We are grateful to our donors for the generosity and unwavering faith in our mission. In partnership with you, there are no limits to the success stories that we can help create and propel together.

A heartfelt thank you to our dedicated directors, committee members, and management who believe in making a difference.

With your ongoing support, TSF will continue to build and sustain the permanent endowment fund that strengthens the Ukrainian cultural identity in Canada. Our hope is that, in return, you will be inspired by the projects that have been fueled with your gifts. Looking forward, let’s ensure that the passionate and vibrant Ukrainian Canadian cultural legacy also enriches and inspires the generations of the future.



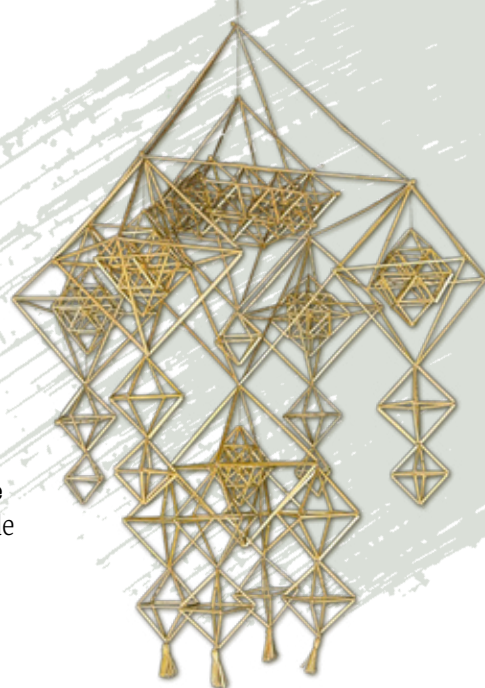

Celebrating a Legacy: Hoosli @ 55

Hoosli Ukrainian Male Choir evolved from the St. Vladimir's College Alumni Choir in Roblin, Manitoba. From singing Divine Liturgies and social events, the choir, renamed Hoosli in the seventies, discovered its niche as a male choral ensemble. Hoosli is integral to the Manitoba culture scene having released 10 albums, collaborated with acclaimed artists, and performed in the most prestigious concert halls.

The Understandable Girl is a story of the importance of a first friendship between a young Canadian girl and young Ukrainian refugee told through the universal language of creative play and puppetry. The play demonstrates how little imagination it takes to understand someone if you really listen.

Preserving Endangered Art Forms

Bozena Hrycyna, a folk artist and community educator based in the Ottawa Valley, Ontario, was awarded the 2025 **REACH Mentorship/Residency for the Arts**.

The artist received funding for intensive training in traditional Ukrainian straw weaving (solomopletinnya), an endangered cultural craft. She will study weaving techniques at Serfenta, a UNESCO-accredited NGO in Poland, followed by four weeks of direct mentorship with master artisan Maria Kravchuk in Ukraine.

The REACH Mentorship/Residency for the Arts is a project of The Shevchenko Foundation in partnership with the Ihnatowycz Family Foundation. Now in its seventh year, the REACH program, offering up to \$30,000 in funding, calls on emerging Canadian artists to reach for their career dreams by seeking opportunities for mentorship, residency, internship, training, workshop, and research.

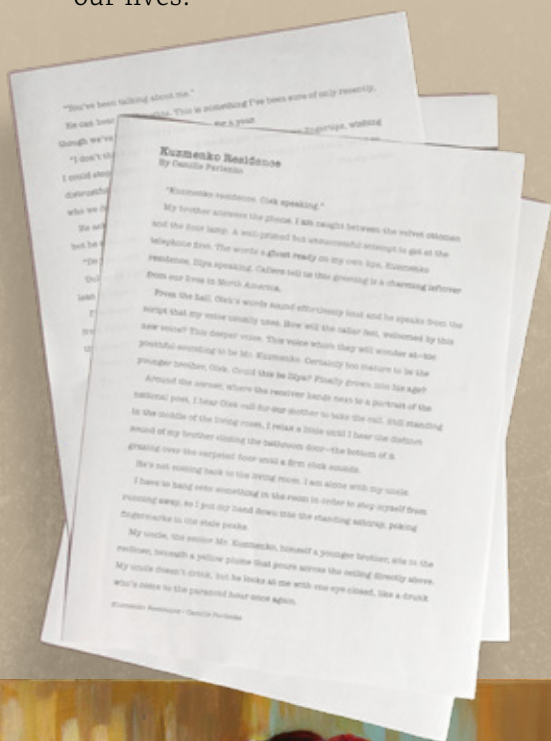

Navigating Intergenerational Tensions



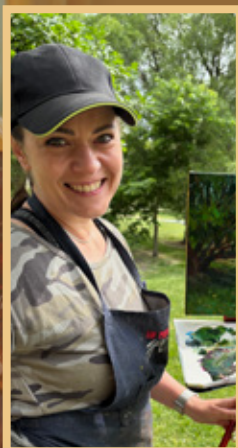

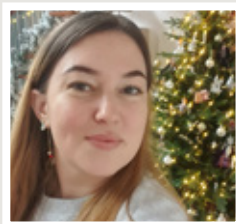

INTERNMENT LEGACY

The Canadian WWI Internment Legacy Fund (Internment Legacy), a continuation of the Canadian First World War Internment Recognition Fund, is an endowment that supports projects to commemorate and recognize the experiences of ethnocultural communities affected by the First World War internment operations.

A major project completed in 2025 by the Internment Legacy is **Project Roll Call** which identifies the men, women, and children who were interned in Canada during World War I. The Project also includes Canadian newspaper articles from this historical period.

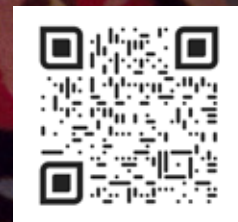

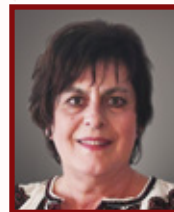

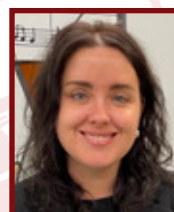

The Shevchenko Foundation Investment Committee Report

Year Ended March 31, 2025

The past fiscal year was one in which investors were rewarded for staying disciplined and ignoring the headlines.

Long-term interest rates peaked in the spring of 2024 and remained elevated throughout the year. Global events – wars in Ukraine and Gaza, unrest in Pakistan, and recurring trade tensions with tariffs imposed and lifted – all created volatility and uncertainty. Despite these challenges, markets proved resilient. In fact, markets reached their lowest point shortly after our year-end, on April 8, 2025, just eight days into the new fiscal year. Looking back, investors who remained patient and ignored the headlines experienced strong returns.

Throughout the year, we were presented with many reasons to adjust our portfolio mix. Instead, we stayed committed to our disciplined investment process. The only structural change implemented was in January, when the Committee approved shifting the Foundation's fixed income mandate from Mawer and Nexus to Canso Investment Management Ltd. This decision followed 18 months of careful review of our fixed income managers, their strategies, and a national search for alternatives.

PERFORMANCE

For the year ended March 31, 2025, the Foundation achieved an overall return of 10.1%, which is also consistent with our five-year average annual return. The main contributors to last year's performance were strong equity results from Mawer, Nexus, and RBC.

ALTERNATIVE INVESTMENTS

Brookfield Infrastructure V (BIV V):

In December 2022, the Foundation committed USD \$5 million to Brookfield Infrastructure Limited Partnership (BIV V). As of March 2025, approximately half of this commitment has been drawn. While private equity investments typically take more than a year to begin reflecting valuation gains, early indications suggest BIV V is off to a promising start. Our investment thesis remains to capture equity-like returns with reduced volatility.

Nicola Wealth Real Estate Strategies:

We have now completed our \$5 million commitment to Nicola Wealth Management's real estate platform, split relatively equally between Canadian and U.S. strategies. Results in 2025 were muted, reflecting broad declines in real estate values due to higher interest rates. Nonetheless, the portfolio maintains strong operational fundamentals, including high occupancy rates in its multifamily, industrial, and storage holdings. These assets continue to generate growing cash flows and pay annual distributions of approximately 4%. We remain confident in Nicola's long-term ability to unlock value within its portfolio.

We also experienced changes in Committee membership this year. Nataliya Stasyuk, CFA, Senior Institutional Investment Consultant with Mercer Investment Consulting, stepped down from the Committee. Nataliya’s expertise and contributions were invaluable, and she will be greatly missed. At the same time, we are pleased to welcome Konstantine Zhadan CFA, CAIA, Head of Risk Management and Portfolio Analytics at Foyston, Gordon & Payne Inc. Konstantine brings deep expertise in portfolio risk analysis that will enhance our oversight and strengthen our understanding of portfolio dynamics.

CLOSING

As Chair, I would like to extend my gratitude to The Shevchenko Foundation Board of Directors and our investment partners for their ongoing support, and to my fellow Committee members for their hard work and commitment. The Shevchenko Foundation is well served by a highly talented and experienced Investment Committee, and I remain confident in our collective ability to steward the Foundation’s assets responsibly and effectively.
